# First – find the scholarships

#### Make a schedule - and stick to it

- Identify the deadline
- Estimate how long it will take you
  - Make sure you can complete it before the due date.
    - If not, adjust your schedule or seek out assistance.
    - Keep in mind your other responsibilities.
    - Schedule time to work on it.
- Allow time to have your essay reviewed by a peer or a professional before you submit your work.





#### Prepare to write the essay



- Review essay requirements:
  - The length of the essay
  - The topic
  - Required formatting
  - Required file type (PDF, or .Doc)
- Review scholarship description and eligibility
  - Note the award amount
  - Eligibility requirements (grade level, GPA, field of study etc.)
  - Important information about the purpose of the scholarship



#### Prepare to write the essay

- Know your audience
  - Review the organizations' goals
  - Connect with the scholarship coordinator if you have questions.
    - Review the scholarship description FIRST
    - Ask unique and specific questions.
- Brainstorm and write down the different ideas that you have






# Draft an outline

- Include ALL essay requirements
- Make it personal and passionate!
  - Include compelling information about your life experiences
- Incorporate your accomplishments
  - Not just a list think about the flow of the essay.
- Make sure your outline differs from your resume
  - You want to provide more details beyond just your work experience
  - Give the scholarship committee the chance to get to know YOU!



# Add to the outline

- Take the bullet points from your outline and add to them
  - Build each point into sentences, and paragraphs and you have your first draft.
- Add an introduction and a conclusion paragraph





# Editing

- Review your grammar and spelling
  - Use spell check in Microsoft Word
  - Read through the paper sentence by sentence and then paragraph by paragraph to check for continuity
- Check your format
  - Make sure it meets all requirements
- Have a peer or a professional proofread the essay
  - Feel free to contact the <u>Walker Center</u> to schedule an appointment.



#### Submitting your Essay Before clicking SEND make sure...

- Send from your student/professional email address
  - Avoid sending from a personal address.
- Email Subject
  - Include the name of the scholarship in the email subject.
- Include an appropriate note
  - Not too long! You don't need to write another essay, but don't send a blank email.
- Include your information in the body of the email
  - Your name & contact phone number
- Check the File Type
  - Review scholarship requirements and ensure that you are sending the preferred file type (if stated).
  - If one is not state, select a universal file type (like a PDF or a Word document).
  - Avoid sending a Google Document as it may not open properly.



# Follow Up

- Confirm that your application was received and is complete.
- Follow up after any posted selection date if you haven't heard anything.
- Be sure to send a thank you note to the selection committee and complete any other required steps.
  - Some scholarships will require a formal thank you letter to the organization, others might invite you to an event to present the award.
  - Make sure you follow through to ensure that you receive your award!
